## Green Flag

### Why?

- Producing sustainably minded, environmentally conscious people
- Tackling environmental problems both on a local and transnational level
- Use synergy effects from different environmentalist cultures
- Contributing to reach the sustainable development goals set forth by UN

#### Who?

- Local school
  10 students | 2 teachers
- Partner school10 students | 2 teachers
- age 17 to 20
- National NGOs (Deutsche Gesellschaft für Umwelterziehung e.V.) for certification of both schools

### Activities for a 2-year project

- finding a partner school
- transnational meeting (+ training on environmental topic (2 teachers/school))

#### 1. Form an Eco Committee

- is student-led
- updates the school about the progress of the project
- meets regularly to discuss environmental and social actions

#### 2. Carry out a Sustainability Audit

- investigate the environmental and social issues in the school
- choose two topics out of twelve

#### 3. Action Plan

- create an Action Plan to resolve or improve the two problems
- Includes: the necessary tasks, the people responsible and time frame for actions in order to achieve your goals/targets (SMART)
- Both schools work on eTwinning platform

### Examples of Themes



#### Waste

Examines the impact of waste on the environment and explores actions to minimise the amount of waste that we produce and dispose of on a daily basis.



#### Water

Provides an introduction to the importance of water both locally and globally and raises awareness of how simple actions can substantially cut down water use.

### Activities, Results and Outcomes

- 4. Monitor and Evaluate
  - monitoring methods will depend on the targets and measurement criteria decided on
  - Assessment carried out by partner school
- 5. Inform and Involve (dissemination)
  - E.g. school newsletters and websites
  - local and national press
  - Global Action Day
- 6. Produce an Eco Code (branding)
  - A statement or/and symbol that represents the school's commitment to sustainability
- 7. Curriculum work | mission statement of school

# School exchange

- 1 week each school
- Both meetings in narrow time frame

## The Green Flag

- After two years of implementing the programme schools can then apply for and be awarded the Green Flag.
- External assessment by national organization (Deutsche Gesellschaft für Umwelterziehung e.V.)



### Follow-up

- After the first Green Flag, other means of assessment are allowed, although visits are always recommended. Assessment should be carried out on a yearly basis.
- Results of monitoring should be regularly updated and displayed for the whole school to see
- Long-term bilateral partnership between schools



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
